Ulrika Domellöf Mattsson works at the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency. Her focus within the Library society is on coordination and development, especially in technical areas and in the area of copyright and licensing. She is also working on open data/open access policies and strategies and is currently leading national/European projects on linked data and indicators for her Agency.

Ulrika started to work at libraries as very young, then studied law but returned to libraries. She got her library exam in Borås 1990 and worked for several years at the National Library of Sweden. She also had three children and studied an MA in Comparative Literature at University College of London during this time. She was in the project where the National Library computerized its lending system. The years at the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency has been very suitable for development, one of her projects here was the first implementation in Sweden of the discovery system Primo, another to join the DiVA consortia (open access repository) as the first governmental agency.

For six years Ulrika has been a member of the national executive committee of the Swedish Library Association, and she has also been involved in different national library groups. She was earlier head of a network of governmental libraries within the Swedish Library Association. She is chair of the Swedish user group for Ex Libris products (ELUGswe), member of the DiVA strategy group, vice chair of the steering committee for the Swedish national library system LIBRIS and has been a member of the EBLIDA executive committee for three years focusing on copyright issues as chair of EGIL.
